

# **Religious Affiliation**

- By law, Census Dept. is not permitted to ask about religious affiliation
- As population demographics change, there is a broadening of religious and cultural diversity

## **How Comforters Are Created**

- God never wastes anything
- He often calls us to use our pain to minister to others.
- Scriptures are always there for us.

### 2 Corinthians 1:4

1:4 who comforts us in all our troubles so that we may be able to comfort those experiencing any trouble with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

Job asked a challenging question during his time of suffering: Job 2:10

• "Shall we actually accept good from God but not accept adversity?"

Even hardship has a place in the Lord's plan.

## Think about the kind of people you seek out when you feel hurt.

- You want someone who has felt your pain,
- A person who's walked the path you're on
  - one can understand your suffering
    - and provide wise counsel.

### According to the apostle Paul,

- passing through a "valley experience"
  - prepares us to be a blessing and encouragement
    - to those who are going through hard times.

### We have to accept the adversity God has placed in our way

• and choose to learn from the situation.

#### God is the Lord of our life,

He has called us as comforters and encouragers

#### As His servants,

- we must be willing to receive whatever training that is necessary
  - to complete His will,
- This including the times when it hurts.

#### Even in suffering,

- we can trust that He loves us
  - and has a plan and purpose for our life.
